I. 144,000 Jews

- Angels holding back the four winds.
 - A. Holding back the winds would dramatically affect the weather.
 - B. Prevailing winds are the winds which blow more often from one direction than another. Winds can greatly affect the amount of precipitation an area receives depending on the amount of moisture they are carrying. These prevailing winds can move air masses from the ocean onto a continent bringing moisture onto the continent. Or prevailing winds may move drier air from the continent to the ocean.
 - C. Prevailing winds directly affect the climate of an area.
 - 1. Holding back the winds would generate much heat upon the earth.
 - 2. This would also create a pollution problem in major cities.
